O R D E R

The petitioner has been arrested on allegations
criminal conspiracy which resulted in the murder of
Bankar Guha Niyogi, a labour leader of Bhillai. Applican^t
is that he is absolutely innocent. He was neither
friend of Chandra Kant Shah, who is said to have
minded the elimination of the deceased, nor
he having any enmity with Shri Niyogi. Due to

party of accused Chandrakant Shah has been tried on supplementary facts by this Court vide order dated 21.11.1971, passed in H.C.G.C. No. 3299/71. The applicant is entitled to be released on bail for the above stated reasons.

2. The prosecution case is that Shankar Patel Miyogi was a popular leader known at Durgadhuli. The Durgadhuli area of Indapur is so much filled by the activities of Shri Miyogi that the name of Durgadhuli is unknown to him. Chandrakant Shah, therefore, hatched a criminal conspiracy with the policemen and others in connection whereof forged arms were recovered from Balpur on 22.4.1971 ultimately as a result of this conspiracy Miyogi was shot by a hired assassin by Name Palkon Hallah alias Kewal, now he still according to Chandrakant Shah is trying to be released on bail is also absurd.

3. It was argued on behalf of the State that it is accepted by the deceased he was advised from S. It appears that this applicant was the left-hand man of Ganesh Prakash Rishi, one of the co-accused. There was no evidence of witnesses to show that the applicant along with other co-accused were given in company of accused in Pagoda Road alias Ravi on 22.4.1971, after which the master of Miyogi took place. Then it was stressed that Ravindra Kumar Ali Patel, the driver, who took the party to Kathmandu, claimed that after proceeding to Mr. Chandrakant Shah he stated that with such fine guns there will

No difficulty in eliminating Nirmal and Bryan Brar. Hukra has assured him that he will ensure that the work was done. At that juncture, applicant had also supported the optimism of Chadrakant Shah. Then there is the evidence to show that this applicant was instrumental in purchase of ammunition from the Gun Arms shop on 14.9.91 through Venkatesh Kumar Singh on the income of Santnayak.

4. Emphasis was laid on the fact that the applicant is an important member of the gang which committed this heinous crime and if he is released there is likelihood that he will try to terrorize the prosecution witnesses and render assistance to the other existing accused persons viz Palta and Chadrakant Shah in various ways.

5. On consideration of the above arguments, it does not appear necessary in the interest of justice to keep the petitioner in detention any longer. More so because Moolchand Shah and Neeraj Shah have been released on bail. The apprehension that the petitioner may misuse his liberty does not appear to be based on any material.

5. In result, the petition is allowed. The petitioner is ordered to be released on his furnishing personal bond in the sum of Rs. 10,000/- (Rs. Ten thousand only) with one surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of C.J.M. Durg, for his appearance before the trial Court on each date of hearing till the trial concludes.
