A short biographical note on M Radhamohan Rao, President, Lorry Owners' Association (which works in solidarity with the Jatlu union), interviewed on September 22, 2004 in Rajamundri, Andhra Pradesh

M Radhamohan Rao was born on October 25, 1938 in a farmer's family. When Radhamohan grew up he bought a lorry to carry supply materials. He was a member of the Lorry Owners' Association which was formed thirty five years back.

In the beginning, it was Bus and Truck owners' Association but as the bus service was nationalised the lorry owners formed their own organisation operative mainly in the urban areas of the district.

The lorry owners are educated and understand that only through unity their problems could be solved. Hence, they started working in close cooperation with the Jatlu Union that was formed by the loading and unloading workers. Lorry owners always supported their cause and expressed solidarity with all their movements.

Earlier it was difficult to get loan for buying the trucks but now the loan system has become easier with the support of banks and finance companies. However, the premiums have to be paid in time. The owners are in a hurry to pay back and accept any hiring charges. This attitude has caused a disbalance in the rates and the lorry owners are facing a crisis today.

The lorry owners organisation is spread all over the state but since number of vehicles is steadily increasing, the branches and units have been created to deal with separate issues.

To avoid unnecessary competition, the lorries have serial numbers and the merchants contact them accordingly. The association has also fixed rates to check on those interested in fast business.

The association has its own jeeps that keep control over the erring members and other difficulties. There are 31 branches functioning in different mandalas in the district. The association has its own Mandapam in various places to be used by the members or taken on hire out by others.

Radhamohan has always worked in close contact with Jatlu Union and its president Prabhakar Chaudhry who has always helped them in crisis.
