Dear Comrade,

Thanks very much for the invitation to attend your 8th annual conference at Madras.

Your conference is being held at a time when the need for a united move on the part of Central Government Employees' organisations to deal with the important issues of getting a real bipartite negotiating machinery to settle the grievances of the employees and changing the present formula of payment of D.A. to one which does not make the employees to wait for one year and more is very imperative.

Fundamental Right of strike of trade unions is not repugnant to the right of collective bargaining including bipartite or tripartite negotiations, and adjudication or arbitration. In no part of democratic world to encourage collective bargaining, right of strike is to be banned or its giving up made a pre-condition. In fact a sound negotiating machinery working effectively is the only guarantee for avoiding strike actions. That is what will make the strikes superfluous and not preconditions or legal ban.

To make the Negotiating Machinery a success all issues which arise among the workmen should find a way of solution through bipartite talks. Imposing restrictions on the discussions and settlement of issues is allowing loophole in the machinery, reducing its effectiveness and thus weaken or sabotage the machinery.

There should be no interference from the employers or the management in the right of the unions to select their negotiators. And it is in the interest of the employees and the employers to deal with industrial unions representing all sections of workers employed in an industry or undertaking that sectional or craft unions.

Quick decisions and its prompt implementation will encourage the unions to resort to utilise more and more the Negotiating Machinery to settle their issues and it will help building faith in it.

In short tripartite negotiations and settlement of the issues through arbitration whenever necessary, with the fundamental right of trade unions of strike as a stand by; discussion and arbitration of all issues arising ~~and~~ between the management and the workers and their quick settlement and implementation are the basis of real collective bargaining machinery. Among the central Government employees such a machinery is urgently needed and the Central Govt. Employees' Trade Union organisations have to carry on their agitation for it.

Some comrades feel that ~~it~~ if such an ideal machinery is not forthcoming at present, just as we accept part settlement of demands, we should also accept the machinery with whatever drawbacks it has and ~~continue~~ continue our efforts at making it a model one.

Enhancement of D.A. for another 10 points average which even according to the Central Pay Commission recommendations has reached in January 1964 is due. At the same time Central Government Employees have to fight for changing this abnoxious formula. D.A. should be linked with the cost of living index with full neutralisation and revised half yearly.

Your union has played a leading role in the movement of Central Government employees for common demands and I am sure the above issues will engage attention of the conference.

Dear Sir,

We take much pleasure in informing you that the 8th Annual General Conference of Divisional Insurance Employees' Association, Jalpaiguri, is scheduled to be held on 30th & 31st of May and 1st June, 1964 at Jalpaiguri.

You know that the life insurance employees constitute a wide section of middle class employees and they have already played a significant role in the trade union movement of the country. Within 8 years since the establishment of Life Insurance Corporation of India, not less than four agreements have been concluded between the Association and the authorities which have enabled the employees to wrest monetary benefits of no mean significance. All these agreements were the outcome of negotiated settlements between the two parties.

Whatever may be our success it is also true that in the background of the spiralling rise of prices of essential commodities which was also spurred by the fiscal measures of the Government it has already become almost non-existent. We have ultimately succeeded to link up our Dearness Allowance with the All India Consumer's Price Index providing neutralisation upto 75% and 100% in the cases of clerical and sub-ordinate staff, respectively, yet this has not been sufficient to protect our real wage owing to incorrect computation of the index numbers which has proved beyond doubt by a number of commissions especially instituted for the

Our All India Organisation, i.e. All India Insurance Employees' Association, have, recently, started a joint all India Campaign together with the All India Bank Employees' Association to urge upon the Union Govt. to take immediate measures as to ensure price-stability and recast the fraudulent compilation of the Price Index.

The All India Insurance Employees' Association, of which we are a Divisional Unit, ever since the inception of the L.I.C.I., has been demanding recognition of itself as the sole bargaining agent of the employees of the Corporation, not only because we represent more than

90% of the total employees in the Industry throughout India and that the L.I.C. authorities conduct negotiations with us, but also from the point of view of establishing harmonious relations between the employees and authorities. Exclusive recognition fosters, encourages and promotes healthy collectivism which is the only alternative to infinite interference with the individual. We trust, our view-point will receive your sympathetic appreciation.

You are probably aware that the Board of Directors of L.I.C. of India have recently decided to bring about an overall change in the pattern of its present organisational set-up with a bias to centralised administration instead of the process of decentralisation which had so long been adhered to. This would, inevitably, result in mass transfer of employees from one place to another and further influx in the over-populated cities where housing problem is every day assuming menacing proportions. The installation of imported electronic machines would also plug further recruitment for a long time when is, you will agree, not justified or consistent in the context of the employment position of the country. The most important point is, however, the serious dislocations that must, following it, come about in the matter of servicing to the policyholders especially in view of the fact that the ~~new~~ business has been increasingly developing in the rural areas constituting a large proportion of illiterate persons for whom, in case of re-organisation, to receive adequate attention would most probably be a "distant cry". We wish your voice raised against this regressive step.


Apart from these problems, our 8th Annual Conference will also deliberate upon a few other vital problems, such as evasive attitude of the L.I.C. management to start negotiations on Medical Aid and other pending issues.

We are, no doubt, aware that we are pledged to work for the success and triumph of the public sector, to give our best to the policyholders and thereby materially help the cause of the public sector of which we are a proud part.

Our Conference will, therefore, feel encouraged and greatly enthused if you kindly grace the Conference with your kind presence. In case you are pre-occupied, may we request you to kindly favour us with your valued comments, suggestions and advice?



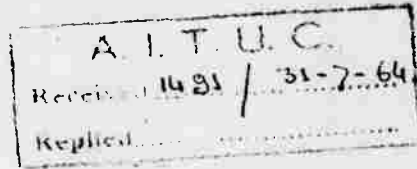

Thank you for your letter of 29th July on the
convocation of your Annual Conference.

On behalf of the AITUC, we wish your conference success. It is not without reason that the union conferences this year are primarily concerned with the wages and D.A. questions and are planning steps to protect the interests of the workers and employees. It is a pity that spokesmen of the Government should now start theorising on the dubious benefits from increase in D.A. which, they allege, will only add to the inflationary spiral. But this argument cannot meet the cold fact that the wages of the Central Government employees, as of others, have been depressed to utterly miserable levels and even with the latest part neutralisation upto 135 points, 12 points still remain to be made up reckoning the all-India index upto May this year. These facts lead the working class to consider ways and means of registering effective actions, on a united national scale, which could at least arrest a hopelessly deteriorating situation. The AITUC hopes that its appeal for united action would meet with response from all sections of the trade union movement.



ON SOCIAL SECURITY SCHEMES

Satish Loomba,
Secretary, AITUC

The principle of social security is that the society should ensure essentials of living to its useful members who due to conditions beyond their control cannot work for the time being. For the right to work is an individual right but the duty to supply work is that of the society as a whole. In socialist countries, the contingencies under which a person may not be able to work are of the nature of old age, physical or mental disability due to any cause and continued ill-health and social security extends to cover not only these but also loss of the breadwinner due to death. In capitalist countries, however, the list has to be extended to cover the largest contingency of all - unemployment. Any scheme of social security in our country, which has capitalist economy, has to be judged in this light.

Social security must necessarily cover all workers whether in the fields or factories or offices.

However, the present schemes cover only a very small portion of our working people and the range of contingencies is also limited. Whatever schemes are there cover only a section of industrial and office workers. There is no unemployment benefit, there is no scheme of old age pension except for government employees, the provident fund scheme covers only a portion of workers and that too at extremely low rates, such gratuity schemes as exist are won by workers from factory to factory. Even when workers' services are terminated due to closure or retrenchment, he gets a pitifully small, non-continuing benefit.

What then goes by the name of social security in our country is only sickness and medical benefit, maternity benefit, accident compensation, apart from the provident fund scheme. The Workmen's Compensation Act, providing for payment in case

of disability or death due to accidents while on duty is now replaced in case of more and more workers by the ESI scheme. However, ^{the benefit under the} ~~the~~ Workmen's Compensation Act was non-contributory so far as the workmen were concerned; the ESI is contributory. Hence in this case, at least, workers now have to pay for a benefit for which previously the sole liability was that of the employers.

The ESI scheme has been accepted by the workmen although it has many statutory defects and there are many more in its actual working. One of the basic points is that if social security is the duty of the society as a whole, why should the worker be asked to pay at a heavy rate for such limited benefits as he is entitled to?

In India workers do not get a living wage. In fact, if wages are properly calculated in terms of correct cost of living indices, today many do not get even subsistence wages and a majority would be covered only upto the subsistence wage level. However, profits are continuously mounting. In such a situation, the responsibility for financing any scheme of social security should be of the employer and the Government. This would also be in accord with the objective of a socialist economy which the rulers claim they want to establish.

On the basis of principles, I would therefore say that all schemes of social security should be without contribution of money from the workers and they should be all-inclusive, covering all contingencies including unemployment relief and old age pensions, etc., for all sections of workers all over the country. On the basis of immediate feasibility, I would suggest that at least all existing schemes should be made non-contributory and a phased programme of extension to cover all industrial workers and their dependants within a very short period should be worked out.

The Andhra Pradesh Teachers' Union

CONSTITUTION

1. NAME :

This Association shall be called "The Andhra Pradesh Teachers' Union" its initials being A. P. T. U. and its jurisdiction shall extend over all the districts of Andhra Pradesh and its head-quarters shall be from time to time being, the place where the Secretary resides.

2. OFFICE :

The Registered Office of the Union shall be situated in the premises of the Krishna District Teachers' Guild Home, Gandhinagar, Vijayawada - 2.

3. DEFINITIONS :

(a) A. P. T. U. wherever it occurs in these rules means "The Andhra Pradesh Teachers' Union".

(b) District Guild means a teacher's organisation open to all teachers and accepted by the A. P. T. U. as its district constituent.

(c) Association means any Teachers' Association formed in any Elementary or Secondary School or College.

(d) Affiliation fee means the amount payable by Guilds and Associations for purposes of affiliation to the A. P. T. U. on admission.

(e) Membership fee means the annual subscription payable by Guilds or Associations affiliated to the A. P. T. U. and also by individual members.

4. OBJECTS :

The objects of the A. P. T. U. shall be :

(a) the promotion of corporate feeling among the members ;

(b) the advancement of education in the Andhra Pradesh ;

(c) the improvement of educational methods and research; and

(d) the safeguarding and the betterment of the status, pay and prospects of the teachers.

5. PROGRAMME :

The objects shall be secured by

(a) opening of a Teachers' Registry;

(b) discussing questions affecting education and the profession;

(c) eliciting the opinion of the affiliated associations and Guilds on educational questions and taking action wherever necessary;

(d) making representations to the authorities concerned on all questions of importance;

(e) holding Conferences at least once a year.

(f) organising District Teachers' Guilds;

(g) forming Teachers' Associations wherever possible ;

(h) Co-operating with other Educational Organisations;

(i) instituting a protection fund.

(j) running a Journal of the A. P. T. U.

(k) founding Information and Employment Bureaus.

(l) organising a publication section.

6. MEMBERSHIP :

(a) Membership of the A. P. T. U. shall be open to;

1. District Teachers' Guilds.

2. Teachers' Association of Schools which have already been affiliated to the District Teachers' guild.

3. Individual Teachers, Clerks, and Librarians of Schools and Colleges and Inspecting Officers.

4. Persons interested in Education.

7. ENROLMENT :

Those falling under 6 shall forward an application in the prescribed form along with the affiliation or membership fee or both as prescribed in 8.

8. AFFILIATION FEE :

(a) On payment of an affiliation fee of Rs. 25 on admission together with annual membership fee of Rs. 25 a District Teachers' Guild enjoys full Membership of the Andhra Pradesh Teachers Union.

(b) On payment of an affiliation fee of Rs. 15 on admission, a union or association of a category of Teachers of a Taluk or Town shall first be admitted as an associate member, with a membership fee Rs. 15 per year.

(c) On payment of Rs. 10 a teachers' association of a School shall become an associate member. This membership must be renewed year after year.

9. MEMBERSHIP FEE :

An affiliated Guild or Association or individual member whose affiliation fee or subscription for the year has not been paid by the 1st December of the Official year of the A. P. T. U. shall not be entitled to enjoy the privileges of the A. P. T. U. until the subscription is paid. The names of such Guilds or associations or individuals shall be removed if they should be in arrears, consecutively for three months. The Official year of the A. P. T. U. is from 1st July to 30th June.

(a) Individual members :

Annual Subscription for Individual members shall be at the following rates :-

- Rs. 1-0-0 for teachers getting upto Rs. 100
- Rs. 2-0-0 for teachers getting between Rs. 100 - Rs. 150
- Rs. 3-0-0 for teachers getting Rs. 150 and above (basic pay)

(b) Life members :

Individual Teachers or those interested in education will become life members on payment of a fee of Rs. 50. This fee shall go to the permanent endowment fund.

10. THE COUNCIL :

The management of the A. P. T. U. shall vest in a body called the council of the A. P. T. U. Besides office bearers and the Executive Committee, shall consist of :-

(a) Ex-Office bearers, provided they pay individual membership fee of Rs. 5/- per year.

(b) The President and Secretary of each affiliated District Teachers' Guild Ex-Officio and two more representatives of the guild.

(c) Two representatives of every affiliated Association falling under 8(b).

(d) One representative of every association falling under 8(c).

(e) Four representatives of the Reception Committee.

(f) Representatives of individual members falling under 9(a) at the rate of one for every ten, elected from among themselves, wherever possible, or nominated by the President of the A. P. T. U.

(g) Three lady educationists co-opted by the President of the A. P. T. U. and

(h) Members elected from the Teachers' Constituency to the A. P. Legislative Council.

This Council shall be the subjects committee for the annual conference and shall meet just before the annual conference, to approve the draft programme suggested by the Executive Committee and also to consider resolutions to be moved at the conference. This council shall constitute an Editorial Board for the Andhra Teacher and it shall continue to function during the pleasure of the council. The quorum for the Council shall be 10.

II. (a) Office bearers and Executive Committee.

The Council of the A. P. T. U. shall elect the following office bearers from among themselves at its meeting towards the close of the annual conference :-

- (i) A President.
- (ii) Three Vice-Presidents for the three zones covering the three University areas.
- (iii) A Secretary and Treasurer.
- (iv) Three Joint Secretaries, one for each zone.

1. The Executive shall consist of 88 members at the rate of 2 per each district elected by the guilds. If the names of the elected members are not received before the end of July every year, the President of the A.P.T.U. will nominate them in consultation with the President of the Teachers' Guild concerned. The quorum for a meeting of the Executive Committee shall be 5. Vacancies during the year shall be filled up by the Executive Committee.

2. The President of the A. P. T. U. shall be responsible for the work of the year and shall preside over all the meetings of the Executive Council and the conference of the A. P. T. U. In his absence one of the Vice

Presidents will preside. The President shall nominate an organisational Secretary if necessary preferably a lady member.

8. The Secretary - Treasurer shall :

(a) call meetings of the Council and Executive Committee in consultation with the president.

(b) record the proceedings of the meetings in books kept for the purpose.

(c) carry on correspondence.

(d) Edit and Publish bulletins containing the Proceedings and resolutions of the council and Executive Committee and information regarding the progress made by the A. P. T. U. and constituent members.

12. It shall be competent for the Council of the A. P. T. U. to frame by-laws not inconsistent with the above provisions and to effect alterations in them.

18. No alteration in or addition to the rules of the A. P. T. U. shall be made except at a meeting of the Council of the A. P. T. U., specially convened for the purpose, or at the Annual Conference, with $\frac{2}{3}$ majority of the members present.

विदर्भ गुमास्ता महामंडळाच्या वतीने विदर्भातील गुमास्ते व हॉटेल कामगारांचे ३ रे वार्षिक अधिवेशन नागपूर मुक्कामी शनिवार दि. २५ व रविवार दि. २६ एप्रिल रोजी भरत आहे. हे जाहीर करण्यात आम्हास अत्यानंद होत आहे. मागिल अधिवेशन २५ जुलाई ६१ रोजी शयतमाळला भरले होते. त्यानंतरच्या पावणे तीन वर्षांच्या काळांत विदर्भ गुमास्ता महामंडळाची बरीच प्रगति केली असली तरी गुमास्ते व हॉटेल कामगारांचे अनेक प्रश्न अजून सुटायचे आहेत. पांच हजार लोकवस्तीच्या गांव शहरांना गुमास्ता कायदा व किमान वेतन कायदा लागू होऊन नियंत्रण अधिक कडक व्हावे ही आपली मागणी होती, परंतु कांही अपवाद वगळल्यास, ह्या बाबतीत सरकारचे धोरण उदासीनतेचे राहिले आहे. जेथे स्थानिक संस्थाकडे कायद्याचे नियंत्रण आहे, तेथे कायद्याची अत्यंत अवहेलना होत असून कायद्याने मिळालेल्या सवलतीचा फायदा गुमास्त्यांना मिळत नाही. हे सर्व प्रश्न नागपूरच्या संमेलनात पुन्हा चर्चेस येणार आहेत.

वाढत्या महागाईने गुमास्त्यांची झालेली दुर्दशा

भाबवाड व महागाईमुळे गुमास्त्यांना जीवन जगणे अत्यंत कठिण झाले आहे. मोठे उद्योग, कारखाने व सरकारी नोकरीतील मजूरांनी बळबळीच्या जोरावर पगारवाढ, महागाईबत्ता व बोनस मिळविला. गुमास्ता वर्ग सध्या प्रवृत्तिचा व असंचटित असल्याने त्याला सुटपुंज्या पगाराशिवाय इतर कोणत्याही सवलती नाहीत. यामुळे त्यांची आर्थिक परिस्थिति फारच केविलवाणी झाली आहे. महागाईचा ताण व जीवनाच्या यातना मोठ्या कष्टाने सहन करणे हेच त्यांच्या नशिबी आहे. या उलट व्यापारी वर्गाने भाबवाडीचा भरपूर फायदा घेऊन वेळोवेळी मालमिला. मात्र ह्या कमाईमधून घंघातील सहकारी गुमास्त्यांना उत्पन्न वाटा, स्वसुखीने देण्याची व्यापारी वर्गाची तयारी नाही ही खोदाची मोष्ट आहे.

हॉटेल कामगारांची हालत अशीच दुःखी-कष्टी आहे. सरकारने त्यांच्यासाठी जे किमान वेतन निर्धारित केले तेहि त्यांच्या पदरांत पडले नाही. मालकानी हा प्रश्न असून हायकोर्टाचे हांगून ठेवला आहे.

गुमास्ते व हॉटेल कामगारांनो संघटित व्हा.

नागपूरच्या संमेलनात गुमास्त्यांना देणारा महागाईबत्ता पंचेविस टक्के मिळावा ही मागणी पौरदारीने मांडून त्याकरता बळबळीचा कार्यक्रम आखायचा आहे. सहावर्षांपूर्वी ठरले विलेले किमान वेतन आज घडोळा कमी पडते, म्हणून नविन वेतन खेपी ठरविण्यात याची प्रोत्साहित कंडातील संघेची बट काढून टाकण्यात यावी. सध्याचा किमान वेतन

कायदा व गुमास्ता कायदा सर्व गुमास्त्यांना लागू करण्यांत यावा व नियंत्रण अप्रिक कडक करण्यात यावे, हॉटेल कामगारांचे किमान वेतन त्यांच्या पदरांत पडेल अशी उपलब्ध योजना सरकारने त्वरीत करावी अशा अनेक महत्वाच्या प्रश्नांवर अधिवेशनांत विचार होईल. अर्थात, हे सर्व प्रश्न संघटनेच्या बळावरच सुटू शकतील. यासाठी विदर्भातील आठ हि जिल्ह्यांत गुमास्ता संघटना तयार करून त्यांना विदर्भ गुमास्ता महामंडळाच्या झेंड्याखाली एकत्र आणणे हे आपले पहिले उद्दिष्ट आहे. पक्षधार युनियन्स उभ्या करण्यापासून गुमास्त्यांनी अलग राहिले पाहिजे. महामंडळाची उभारणी पक्षनिरपेक्ष पायावरच झाली असून सर्व पक्ष व विचारांचे लोक त्यांत राहू शकतील, असे आमचे धोरण आहे.
